

## British Championships 2004, championship log



### Day 1 23 Aug 2004

Strangford Lough was not looking its best. A fresh south-easterly was blowing drizzly rain into our faces as we waited for Chris Boston to ferry us to our moorings. Earlier, Roderick Monson, Race Officer, had woken to find his anchor dragging and at 0630 had to move the position of his converted fishing boat, Family's Pride, the committee boat, into a better position behind the lee of Trasnagh Island. He had measured the wind speed at 20 knots behind the island, so in the race area it would be fresher, but the forecast was for the wind to drop so he planned to start the first race on time at 1105. He motored to his position in the middle of the race area.

Ashore, there was the expected range of unexpected glitches to overcome to ensure the race started on time. Three of the four large black inflatable course marks had visibly deflated during the night, one of them to the point that it might not stay afloat for the day. It was too wet to effect a repair so it was re-launched with a loud hissing sound coming from it. An additional volunteer to man one of the mark boats was hastily recruited.

On your correspondent's boat the discussion concerned the choice of headsail. We hoisted the No.1 genoa on the way out and found that we were not overpowered. However, a number of other boats had chosen the No 2 and started the race with the smaller sail.

The first race was a windward-leeward and the Race Officer had the marks in position for the warning signal to go up on time. The pre-race manoeuvring seemed tame from my perspective and the Race Officer reported later that the whole fleet had been well back from the line as the race started cleanly. This was our first British Championship and the sight of the start filled at least one of my crew with superlatives at the spectacle of it all. I concentrated on helming.

By the first mark the favourites were at the front of the fleet, Tom White in Pizzicato leading followed by Steve Goacher in Eric the Boat. Unwisely, we gloated briefly as we steered wide of the

mark to avoid Brahms and Liszt helmed by Keith Lord. She had come in on port tack, got caught by the tide and foul wind from those on starboard, and stuck fast on the big black balloon.

The fleet split down the run, with those gibing onto port steering towards the western side of the race area and benefiting slightly from less tide against them. By the end of the first run the position of the leading two had reversed, with Goacher leading White. This was the pattern for the rest of the race with a contest for third and fourth going on between Robbie Richardson in Bad Company and Neil McClure in So. McClure finished ahead of Richardson.

Meanwhile, further back in the fleet on board Triad, we had a pleasing second beat up the western side of the course winning back some of the places we had earlier lost. We won back another two places on the final run by going down the eastern side of the course, evidently we had correctly gauged the turn of the tide. Rounding the leeward mark for the beat back to the finish we had to decide which was the favoured end of the line. We decided the eastern end was better, as did our nearest challenger. Within 100 m of the line he tried to duck under our stern, was caught by a gust and collided hard with our aft port quarter, ripping our push pit out of the deck and allowing Pastiche to get past us to the western end of the line. Not a great start to the Championship!

While the wind had remained a fairly steady south-easterly 4-5, during the course of the first race the rain had stopped allowing us a brief dry interlude to assess our damage, make some temporary repairs and eat our lunches. Before we had time to gulp our sandwiches, the warning signal for the second race had gone, we had to abandon our meal and hoist the No. 1 genoa. This time the whole fleet had made the same choice of headsail.

We chose the port end of the line and started next to the mark as the race started. This time the Race Officer had a harder job, but the start was clean - just. At least one crew had loitered too far away while lunching and we met Saraband helmed by Mark Taylor of Port Dinorwic SC sailing downwind towards the line as the fleet started. By now the rain had returned, getting heavier with the visibility reducing.

We were pleased to see that the two top placed boats had started from the same end of the line and we took the same route to approach the windward mark on port. For them, their superior boat speed got them there before the bulk of the fleet and they had a trouble-free rounding, with Goacher leading White. We weren't so lucky, couldn't find a gap in the line of starboard tack boats approaching the mark, stalled and this was our turn to get caught on the mark and stay there as the entire fleet sailed past.

At the front of the fleet the race was a re-run of the first. During the second round the heaviest rain came through and the windward mark briefly became invisible from the committee boat. This made it difficult for your reporter to see the action at the front from his very unsatisfactory position at the back. We found it more difficult to make up places than in the first race, but we benefited from another port and starboard incident, almost identical to ours in the first race, between the two boats immediately in front of us. Fortunately for them, there was less damage than we suffered in our smash.

## **DAY 2 24 Aug**

This day was best forgotten. Leaden, misty skies, drizzle or intermittent heavy showers and not a breath of wind were the menu. After the postponement was signalled ashore at 0900, one

hundred competitors loitered around the clubhouse chafing to get started on what was meant to be a Round the Lough race. At 1300 the inevitable decision was taken and racing was abandoned for the day. The only positive achievement was the completion of an owners meeting agreeing to move the AGM from the London Boat Show to the British Championship in future. We saw a very good presentation on the venue for next years Championship, Abersoch. Will they be able to organise the weather better than we have?

### DAY 3 25 Aug



Today started dull with a light northwesterly breeze, but as the day went on the clouds thinned and by afternoon there was sunshine, fluffy cumulus clouds, and the breeze had freshened to a brisk force 4 –5. It was a brilliant day, shame about our results.

The first race, a modified Olympic triangle, started on time, but by this stage of the Championship there was more enthusiasm to start early by too many competitors and a general recall resulted. Five minutes later the race started again. Again there were boats over the line and some turned back, but not all as they discovered to their cost later in the day. Four were disqualified. As the race progressed, as on Monday, Goacher and White sailed away on the reaches to finish first and second again.

In Triad we had another bad race. We touched the windward mark at the end of the second beat, had to take a penalty and found ourselves passed by several other boats as we completed the final triangle.

After a hurried lunch the second race started with more boats over the line, but this time no general recall. Four boats failed to turn back and were disqualified. A bias to the starboard end of the line meant the whole fleet started from that end. We sailed a better race and finished seventh after just having been pipped at the finish by Martin Hartly in A# Exit. Unfortunately we suffered more damage, this time self inflicted as Huw Morgan on the foredeck slipped and rammed the spinnaker pole through the No 1 genoa. However at the front there was a change from the previous pattern, with Tom White falling back to ninth place and second place being taken by Robbie Richardson in Bad Company with Ian Smyth third placed in Mouse.

To make up for the lost race on Tuesday, the Race Officer had scheduled an extra windward leeward race. By now it was a perfect sailing afternoon with a brisk breeze and warm sunshine allowing the top layers of clothing to be removed. Once again there was a general recall, once again there were boats over the line at the second start but the race went on. Once again Goacher won with second place going to Ian Smyth and Robbie Richardson third this time.

On getting ashore at the end of racing a rude surprise awaited several boats in the fleet with disqualifications in each of the three races for OCS. Unfortunately Triad was one of them, but So and Cock a Hoop helmed by Paddy Pollock of SLYC both managed to be OCS in 2 races. Afterwards, the Race Officer commented the boats over the line had clearly been so up to a minute before the start, allowing time for their numbers to be taken and events allowed to take their course. Perhaps the fact that the committee boat was lying to the tide and therefore 30 degrees off the wind had misled some competitors?

### DAY 4 26 August

Yesterday's sunshine had gone and we woke to another grey, damp day, with the wind in the west. This brought the windward mark towards the north end of Trasnagh Island and meant the course length was slightly shorter than before. Two windward

leeward races were scheduled and they both got away on time. Following yesterday's disqualifications the fleet were much better behaved on the line and both races started cleanly.

By this stage in the Championship the events of the race tend to blur together in the reporter's mind. The first race was again won by Goacher, but making up for his disqualifications on Wednesday, Neil McClure and his crew in So finished second.

The second race was distinguished by a pile up at the first windward mark as almost the entire fleet arrived simultaneously. In Triad we had boats bounce off us to port and astern. Ian Smyth in Mouse managed to beat the fleet to the first mark and sailed ahead downwind, from where he maintained his lead. With the tide ebbing the right hand side of the course should have been disadvantaged, but the blustery wind coming off the shore it was a lottery as to which was the better side. During the third leg there was a 30 degree wind shift and the Race Officer moved the mark to the southern end of Trasnagh.

Breaking the pattern of the week so far, Ian Smyth emerged as the winner, with So second and Goacher relegated to third. In both of today's races another SLYC boat moved sharply up the fleet, allegedly benefiting from tuning details gleaned from Steve Goacher during Wednesday evening's wine & cheese party: Pastiche helmed by Alistair Fletcher was fourth in both races.

## DAY 5 27 August



A sparkling bright morning for the final day; with wind westerly again and freshening from force 3 to 4 gusting 5 as the morning progressed. Today's racing had to start earlier at 0930. Visiting boats needed to be craned out of the water before the tide fell too low, so we had to be ashore by 1130. In the event Roderick Monson shortened the course and finished the race after 2 rounds of the windward leeward circuit.

There was good clean start and yesterday's pile up at the first mark was avoided. A great first run had the fleet rolling vigorously as the wind freshened and speeds on Triad's log touched 7 knots. Although Steve Goacher did not need to race today, having established an unchallengeable lead, he was on the water and led the race through to the end. John Putt from Parkstone YC gained his best result of the week, finishing second with Tom White in Pizzicato third.

On Triad we added to our collection of disasters for the week and opted to retire after the race following an incident on the finish line when we just failed to get ahead of Andrew Ackroyd in Sonateigna Too.

## Conclusion

Steve Goacher must be congratulated for his outstanding result, in a league by himself. The competition for subsequent places was much more intense with Robbie Richardson winning second place, but his dominance of the SLYC Sonata fleet looks threatened with Ian Smyth a close third and Pastiche challenging strongly as the week progressed.

We must all be grateful to the many volunteers from SLYC who gave up their week to make the event an outstanding success. Your correspondent heard only compliments about the race organisation and administrative arrangements. Roderick Monson and his team were to thank for the former and Jane Mayne, the star event organiser, for the latter.

## Lessons learnt

The Sonata fleet is very closely matched, with all boats in every race of approximately 2 hours duration finishing within 10 minutes of each other, usually much closer.

The average performance of the fleet improved over the course of the event, making tactics relatively more important in relation to the other elements of boat tuning and crew skill.

It was pleasing to see the improved performance of the SLYC Sonata fleet compared to the last time the event was held here. While Goacher maintained his dominance, local boats successfully contested for the subsequent places, auguring well for the future of the class here.

SLYC's big black balloon race marks move towards boats passing them to windward, so give them a wide berth!
